













The Consequences of Leaving School Too Early

"Significant numbers of adolescents from all countries, including Canada, withdraw from the formal education system before attaining a high school diploma, and consequently are lacking in essential skills for the job market and full participation in society."

Risk Factors Fluctuate

"Risk status fluctuates over time, based on circumstances and contexts, and is not a fixed quality. For example, periods of transition can increase risk. Exposure to multiple risk factors increases one's likelihood of experiencing problematic outcomes . . ."

Credit Accumulation

"Students failing to accumulate credits at a pace leading to 30 or more credits by grade 12 were at risk of dropping out"

(From: Secondary School Reform in Ontario and the Role of Research, Evaluation and Indicator Data, 2007)

"King recommended that "(i)n order to improve the likelihood of graduation for students at risk:

- remediation must begin during the first semester of Grade 9;
- (2) opportunities for credit recovery should be made available; and,
- (3) most importantly, courses should be more closely tailored to students' abilities and aspirations."

(King et al, 2005, Double Cohort Study)






